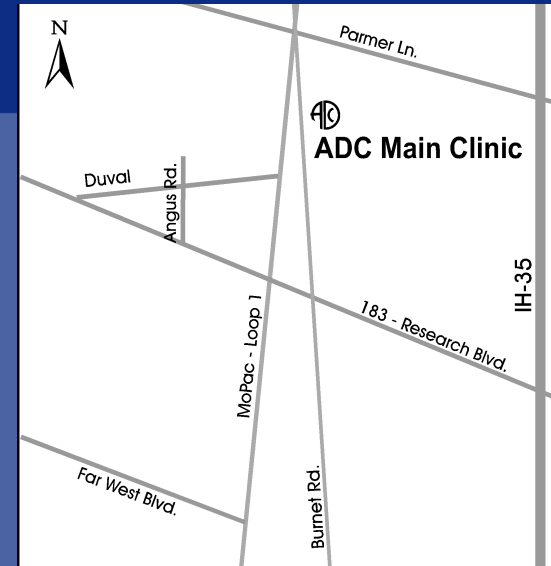


Satish Karnik, M.D.

# Our Practice

Welcome to The Austin Diagnostic Clinic Urology. Our physicians are highly trained in traditional medical and surgical urologic options as well as offering the latest in minimally invasive, technologically advanced techniques. In all cases, your physician will discuss your options and what procedure or treatment is best for you.

## General Urology

Urologists are able to evaluate, diagnose, and prescribe treatments for urinary incontinence, difficulty with urination due to prostate enlargement, erectile dysfunction, kidney stones, and malignancies of the kidney, ureter, bladder, prostate, and testicles.



## Kidney Stones

Kidney stones can be a result of many different things. Some stones can pass spontaneously, depending on their size and location. Other stones can dissolve with medications. And still others, may require a procedure to help remove or pass them,

including non-invasive shock-wave lithotripsy and ureteroscopy (a pencil-thin scope that can break a stone using laser technology). Larger stones may require surgery.

## Erectile Dysfunction (ED)

ED is common. Nearly 50% of men have some degree of ED by age 60. Therapy may include oral medications, vacuum devices, injectable agents, or surgical procedures. In most cases, there is a successful treatment for ED.

## Urinary Incontinence

More and more women are being diagnosed with urinary incontinence. Simple incontinence can often be improved with biofeedback and physical therapy, while more significant incontinence can often be improved with an outpatient 'sling' procedure. This gives the urethra additional support. Still other incontinence can be the result of pelvic prolapse or other situations where the pelvic organs have descended from their normal positions.



## Vasectomy

This sterilization procedure is done over 500,000 times a year in the US. It is a simple, 35 minute procedure, that is done in the office. Most patients experience very little discomfort. The incisions are generally very small and a local anesthesia is used. There is minimal impact on your busy work schedule. Most of our cases are performed on Fridays, giving you the weekend to recuperate.

## Enlarged Prostate (BPH)

BPH, or benign prostatic hypertrophy, is a common reason for decreased force of urinary stream, hesitancy, and urinary dribbling. Treatments include medical therapy, as well as the newest laser technology to remove obstructing prostate tissue.

## Kidney Cancers

More cancers of the kidney are being discovered incidentally, or in the process of x-ray studies being done for another reason. Depending on the size and location of the tumor, many of these tumors can be removed laparoscopically through small key-hole incisions. Also, many of the smaller tumors can be removed with a technique called

partial nephrectomy. This procedure saves the remaining normal kidney, while only removing the portion involved with tumor.

## Prostate Cancer

With annual PSA testing, prostate cancer is being diagnosed earlier than before. This allows for many more treatment options. Options include, observation, hormonal therapy, radiation therapy and surgery. The Austin Diagnostic Clinic offers the latest surgical therapy, Robotic Laparoscopic Prostatectomy, which allows the surgeon to perform a precise procedure with reduced blood loss.

## Appointments

If you need a refill on any medication, contact your pharmacy and they will notify us. Allow 24-48 hours to process your refill.



## Insurance

Urologists are considered specialists by many insurance plans. Your insurance may require you to have a referral to see us. Please check with your insurance provider prior to scheduling an appointment. This will ensure that your care will be covered and your cost minimized. As a rule, managed care plans will not process retroactive referrals. A referral from your primary care physician may take 48-72 hours. We are unable to schedule your appointment without this referral.

## Payment for Services
